This applies to all parents of children born during the period 1<sup>st</sup> September 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> August 2022. You MUST now apply for primary school places as the closing date is **Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2026**. ## Children's Commissioner Report



The Children's Commissioner, Dame Rachel de Souza, has recently published a new guide, *'What I wish my parents or carers knew: A guide for parents on managing children's digital lives'*.

Supporting children's safety is a shared responsibility between families, schools and wider society. For parents and carers, this responsibility has become increasingly complex as children's lives are now deeply intertwined with the digital world. Many parents face difficult decisions about how to balance protecting children from online harm with enabling access to spaces that are now central to learning, socialising and play. This guide focuses on the challenge of managing children's everyday online habits.

## Year 3 Swimming Lessons



in swimming lessons this must be discussed with your child's classteacher or the School Office. I would like to remind you that swimming forms part of the National Curriculum for PE at Key Stage 2 and is not optional.

Please ensure your child has the correct swimming kit in school on Friday's. Please could we encourage you to make a prompt payment via our online payment system [www.parentpay.com](http://www.parentpay.com). If you feel you may have difficulty in paying this amount and would like to discuss this confidentially then please arrange to speak with a member of the School Office staff. Thank you for your support and understanding in this matter.

May I remind you that all children have to wear a suitable costume for swimming (no beach wear!) and a swimming hat. Swimming hats are available via ParentPay at a cost of **£4.00**. It is a really good idea to write your child's name on their hat in large letters in a thick permanent marker as this helps the swimming teachers to call their names and also reduces the risk of it becoming lost.

All children attending must wear their school uniform and will be expected to sit with their classteacher and other class members at the front of the church. Parents/carers are more than welcome to stay and sit in other areas of the church for the service.



In order for us to get a clear indication as to how many children to expect and how many seats to reserve in the church, we would be very grateful if you could indicate with a note confirming your attendance in your child's home school diary. Thank you.

## Finally....

We continue to see an increasing number of children arriving late for school which causes significant disruption, not only to the operational needs of the School Office but also to the child's classroom as they enter late after all the other children are settled. We are all acutely aware that Sawyers Hall Lane and the surrounding area are very busy in the morning and I would strongly encourage you to make sure you leave plenty of time to travel to school making sure you are on the school site before the gates are locked promptly at 8:55a.m. Punctuality is an important life skill and it is very important that we set a good example to our children about the importance of being on time for school every day. I look forward to seeing a rapid improvement in this area.



I would like to remind all parents/carers about the importance of upholding and meeting our school uniform expectations and requirements. We still have a number of children in the incorrect footwear and not wearing appropriate school shoes. Also we have an increasing number of children in school who are seen to be wearing make-up, particularly amongst our girls in Upper Key Stage 2. Make-up (including nail varnish) is not permitted and any child found to be wearing it will be asked to remove it when in school. Any make-up items found in school will also be confiscated and parents/carers asked to collect it from the School Office. Please help us maintain our high standards of age appropriate presentation in school and wear our school uniform with pride. Thank you in advance for your support in this matter.

As you can see there is a lot going on already as we embark on this new term in school. Please do keep up to date with all communications sent out via the school - Parent Hub and the school website being your best sources of information.

Please continue to hold the life and work of our primary school in your thoughts and prayers.
